# Summary of TimelyMD Community College Student Survey to Assess Mental Health and Emotional Concerns Related to Basic Needs

TimelyMD conducted a nationwide survey of college students enrolled at a community college to assess their prevalence of mental health and emotional concerns, especially relating to their ability to meet basic needs. The survey received nearly 900 responses; 80% of students were between the ages of 17 and 34 years old.

## **Questions and Summary Responses:**

- In the past 12 months, have you experienced emotional distress, stress, and/or anxiety due to a lack of basic needs, such as housing, food, technology, childcare or sibling care. etc?
  - o 71%, Yes

  - o 56%, Financial issues
  - o 38%, School
  - 33%, Lack of healthy, balanced diet
  - 31%, Family concerns
